WLES Goal #1

Goal: By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 95% of third-grade students will pass the IREAD 3 assessment.

WLES Goal #2

Goal: By the end of the 2025 - 2026 school year, 85% of third-grade students will pass the ILEARN Math assessment.

WLES Goal #3

Goal: By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 30% and 50% of third-grade students will score a three or more on the Evidence/Elaboration and Organization/Purpose sections of the ILEARN writing rubric in Informative and Narrative writing, respectively.

- Writing team has been working on K-3 writing rubrics aligned to the ILEARN rubric to support a school-wide writing plan.
 - Each grade has collaborated during PLC times to prepare and grade benchmark writing assessments.
 - Curriculum alignment and sharing of resources has resulted in improved writing skills.
 - Professional development to support curriculum work as well.

Enrollment for 2025-2026 School Year

Kindergarten and New Student Roundup was held March 4th

- Over 50 families attended guided tours
- Currently have 77 incoming kindergarten students registered, which is more than we had at roundup last year.
- We will be posting the informational materials to our website for those who were not able to attend the roundup event.
- We continue to reach out to apartment complexes who in turn, share information with new families so that we can get student enrolled!
